



MSP People

MSP employed 38 full-time staff in 2023, made up of the country manager, 7 clinical staff, 10 counsellors, 2 lawyers, 3 MEL officers, 4 project officers, 4 administration staff and 7 support staff. 24 employers were based in the Suva headquarters, 8 in the Lautoka office and 6 in Labasa. We also engaged three volunteers including an M&E officer in the Suva office and a counsellor in Lautoka, as well as a Communications Mentor supported by the Australian Volunteer Program, an initiative of the Australian Government. As 2023 marked the tenth anniversary of Roselyn Prasad joining Medical Services Pacific as its financial manager, and the board and staff thanked Roselyn Prasad for her continued dedication and expertise.




Message from our Country Director

Every year has its own challenges and rewards, and 2023 was no exception. MSP expanded into new territory with the launch of an innovative 3-year project to support a whole-of-community approach to improving women's access to justice in 10 villages in Central Division, funded by the UN Trust Fund to End Violence Against Women. After its first year, the project is showing encouraging results, reflected in both statistical evidence and responses from our partners and focal points. After 13 years, women's sexual and reproductive health rights still continued to dominate MSP's core activities. MSP provided free One Stop Shop clinical, counselling and legal services for survivors of sexual assault, as well as family planning consultations, screening for cervical and breast cancers, NCDs and STIs, and extensive awareness raising in urban, rural and maritime settings. With the marked increase in cases of HIV in 2023, we stepped

A decrease in clients and services in 2023 reflects the conclusion of two major programs: the EU funded COVID-19 programs 2020-22 which saw MSP bring in 30+ volunteers to help disseminate services, and the Reach Mission funded by UNDP in 2018-19, an extensive outreach program to multiple villages in the northern division.

We offer family planning consultations for individuals and couples intentionally manage the number timing of children accordance with their own needs. Sexual & Reproductive Health Rights

Sexual and Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR) safeguard individuals' rights to make informed decisions about their bodies and sexuality without facing discrimination, coercion, or violence. MSP helps women exercise these rights by providing access to family planning information and services, contraception, safe and legal abortion, and prevention and treatment of sexually transmitted infections (STIs), HIV and AIDS.

One Stop Shop Sexual Assault Services

Holistic trauma-informed survivor-focused services are designed to meet the immediate physical, emotional and psychological needs of survivors of assault and traumatic events, while aiding their recovery and healing.

- 1. **Medical attention** MSP provides prompt medical care and forensic examinations by trained professionals to address injuries, gather evidence and mitigate potential health risks such as STIs, HIV and AIDS or pregnancy.
- 2. Counselling and Emotional Support to help survivors steer their way through the aftermath of trauma, manage distress and build resilience.
- 3. **Assistance in navigating processes** such as reporting the assault, seeking justice, ensuring rights, and identifying safety plan.
- 4. **Follow-up care** including medical checkups, counselling, legal services to monitor survivors' progress and support them to regain their autonomy and sense of safety and selfworth.
- 5. Comprehensive education and awareness campaigns to help prevent sexual assault and foster a culture of respect and understanding, as well as sensitivity training for duty-bearers responsible for health and law enforcement.

Combining health, legal and psychological support in a single point of contact reduces the need for survivors to navigate multiple agencies, increases the quality of care, reduces further traumatization, enables continuous case management and promotes recovery.



Counsellors



Counselling

MSP Counselling services offer emotional and psychological support to voluntary clients as well as those referred to them by government agencies and civil society organisations. MSP counsellors receive professional clinical supervision as part of our ethical and therapeutic approach.

The community outreach education and counselling program raises awareness of social protection issues and available support, and promotes the Child Helpline and the counselling assistance we offer for child protection and DV, GBV and SGBV issues.

MSP Case Management Units in Suva, Lautoka and Labasa extend their services beyond individual counselling, also providing psychosocial and psychoeducational support for survivors' family members where appropriate.

Walk-in clients make up 41% of Counselling cases, 15% are referred by Fiji Police, and 44% by the Child Helpline, MHMS and MWCSP and a range of NGOs, faith-based organisations, schools, businesses and individual online searches for assistance.

Legal Support Services

One Stop Shop

MSP provides legal support as a vital component of our holistic One Stop Shop approach to aiding survivors of sexual offences, child abuse, and exploitation. Our medical forensic team offers crucial investigative assistance to survivors, the majority referred by the Child Abuse and Sexual Offences Unit (CASOU) of the Fiji Police.

Outreach and Advocacy

In addition, legal officers are integrated into MSP outreach teams to ensure that advocacy on child protection is robustly reinforced within communities. Moreover, vital knowledge regarding rights pertaining to domestic violence, gender-based violence (GBV), and sexual gender-based violence (SGBV) is disseminated among women in grassroots settings where they are most vulnerable to all forms of violence.

Community Legal Assistance

By offering legal advice in response to referrals from our outreach teams and the Child Helpline, we are promoting legal rights outside institutional walls and extending Access to Justice directly to communities across Fiji.

Empowering Survivors, Strengthening Justice

ONE STORY FROM 2023 STANDS OUT AS TESTAMENT TO THE COURAGE AND RESILIENCE OF SURVIVORS AS WELL AS THE EFFICACY OF MSP'S ONE STOP SHOP APPROACH.

My husband came home intoxicated and started abusing me verbally, emotionally, and physically... I fled from my home without considering my safety or how I would survive. I sought help from the Legal Officer at MSP who reported the incident to the Police on my behalf. I was referred for a medical examination and psychosocial support from an MSP Counsellor. I will never forget the kindness and consideration I got at this difficult time. I followed through on the report, which led to me being called to court to testify. My husband is currently in jail. Through the support of MSP, MHMS, and Fiji Police, my children and I are now safe. I don't live in fear or shame! I never thought I could find the courage to speak up, let alone seek justice. MSP gave me the strength to reclaim my voice in the courtroom. I will forever be grateful.

The Child Helpline



The Child Help Line enables children to seek safe and confidential access to health, education and social support on their terms, and connects children to trained staff who listen, identify risks, provide counselling and make referrals to external and emergency services as required.

MSP has operated the Child Help Line (CHL) on behalf of the Fiji Government's Ministry of Women, Children and Social Protection since it was introduced in April 2015 as part of the Child Protection Multi-Year Work Plan.

The ever-increasing number of calls is an indication of the demand for a reliable Child Help Line with the capacity to respond effectively to the needs of vulnerable children and young people.



In 2023, the Child Helpline received almost 1,800 calls from children needing help with a range of problems, as well as from adults alarmed for their children's safety, such as a woman reporting the possible abduction and exploitation of her 3-year-old grand-daughter and a mother reporting physical abuse of her 15-year-old child by a teacher. MSP looks forward to implementing its partnership with MWCSP to deliver this important service as it moves into its second decade.


Outreach Program

UNTF Project: Sensitizing the Stakeholders and Communities involved in the Prevention of Violence against Women and Girls in Fiji

Violence against women and girls is widespread in Fiji but often goes underreported due to stigma, shame, lack of access to services, and so on. As a women's rights advocate, MSP promotes women and girls' access to resources to create a safer, more equal and just society in Fiji.

This project, funded by the United Nations Trust Fund to End Violence Against Women, engages community leaders, gatekeepers, men and boys, youth, women and girls through information sessions, demonstrations, case scenarios, group work, empowerment and talanoa (interactive dialogue) sessions. Over three years from 2022 to 2025, this project targets ten villages in the Tailevu region. Its primary objective is to enhance and safeguard women's human rights by bolstering the prevention of VAWG within Fiji's Central Division.

In September 2023, the Minister for Women, Children, and Social Protection inaugurated a special initiative undertaken by the 10 local villages aimed at eradicating VAWG within their communities. (see p. 26)

Western Team



As well as comprehensive medical, counselling, legal and social services at our clinic in Lautoka, MSP West engages with communities throughout the Western Division and advocates widely for the advancement of sexual and reproductive health rights for women and girls. In 2023, MSP West reached a total of 6, 282 beneficiaries.

MSP West facilitated a consultation in February with 14 CSOs and relevant government bodies to address increasing numbers of GBV cases and the prevalence of children living on the streets in Lautoka, to gain better understanding of the issues and to develop collaborative strategies for a meaningful response system.

MSP West partnered with Hilton Fiji Beach Resort & Spa in Denarau to mark IWD 2023 alongside the 50 women who work there, offering them free SRHR services. These services included cervical and NCD screenings, breast examinations, family planning consultations, and counseling.

MSP collaborated with the Sugar Cane Growers Fund (SCGF) to participate in their Open Day event held in July in Kabisi, Nadroga. During the event, MSP offered medical check-ups, NCD screenings, SRH services, and counselling to the attending farmers.

Contestants for the Lautoka Sugar Festival Queen title visited MSP to acquaint themselves with our services and cultivate an interest in researching SRH, as well as the eradication of VAWG, as part of their tertiary studies.

MSP West (Lautoka)

Medical Officer, Dr. Salome Dainivalu, was chief guest of the Western Division Fiji Teachers' Association Pinktober program at Ratu Navula College in Nadi where she emphasized the importance of early intervention to treatment outcomes for breast cancer.

MSP West's Clinic Manager Fanny Fiteli was chief guest at the Fiji Police Western Headquarters Pinktober event where she emphasised the importance of frequent breast self-examinations and regular cervical and breast cancer screening.

MSP North and West teams facilitated Child Protection Awareness Training with Women's Fund Fiji grantees Udukacu Women's Group, Taveuni Women Empowerment, Soqosoqo Vakamarama I'Taukei Cakaudrove, Bia-i-cake Women's Group Nagigi, TISI Sangam and Lifebread.

MSP West shared information and advice on WASH initiatives, SRHR, CP, GBV, Family Planning, and IECs at the World Food Day National Agriculture Show organised by the Ministry of Agriculture and Waterways Fiji. MSP West and Soroptimist International, conducted a Pinktober outreach for the women of the Bethel Community Church featuring NCD screening, breast examination, cervical screening, and family planning services.

It was all-hands-on-deck for MSP West team, Police officers and officials from MWCSP and MHMS who volunteered time and materials to clean up and renovate and Vuda District School to accommodate students from Abaca Village.

In November, MSP West visited FRIEND Fiji in Tuvu for breast cancer and cervical cancer screening. Dr Salome again highlighted the importance of early detection to saving lives. Vinaka vakalevu European Union in the Pacific for your continued support.

MSP West organized a special sexual health program and candlelight vigil on World AIDS Day in December to extend solidarity to People Living with HIV and those who have lost their lives to AIDS.





MSP North (Labasa)

MSP's northern team is based in the clinic in Labasa, but much of the team's time is spent working in different areas of the region. In spite of there being no permanent doctor on the team in 2023, MSP North was able to provide services for 3,499 beneficiaries seeking One Stop Shop medical, legal and counselling assistance as well as reproductive health and family planning consultations and awareness sessions.

MSP North worked in collaboration with the Fiji Disabled People's Federation (FDPF) and MHMS to pilot the Disability Inclusion Project on SRHR funded by UNFPA Pacific and the Australian Government in Labasa (Bua and Macuata) and Tukavesi (Buca Bay).

MSP North invited USP students to their Pinktober Open Clinic for education and awareness on reproductive tract cancers, safe sex, contraceptives and menstrual hygiene, while the medical team offered them all free examinations and screenings.

For Creating Awareness on Menstrual Hygiene **MSP** North had the Day, privilege incredible district collaborating with three schools in the Macuata Division - Naseakula, Naduri, and Nabala to embark on a mission to raise awareness about the Menstrual Cycle and Personal Hygiene and ensure that all students had access to essential resources.

MSP North joined with MWCSP to be part of the 2023 Women's Expo in Savusavu 15-16 March attended by women from Cakaudrove, Bua and Macuata who showcased their many handicrafts and built connections and business opportunities. The MSP booth shared IECs and offered consultations and advice on SRHR to participants and visitors.

MSP North supported the IWD program put together by Ronald McDonald House Charities Fiji that supports the Family Room in the Paediatrics Department at Labasa Hospital and provides families with the care and resources they need to help their ill or injured child. MSP facilitated the talanoa session on the IWD theme of 'Embracing Equity' for those present who appreciated the chance to explore the theme more deeply.

Communications

In 2023, our commitment to amplifying awareness of MSP services remained steadfast. We actively connected with the public through various social media channels and our website, sparking interest in our rights-based approach to SRH in urban, rural, regional, and international communities. Our social media presence reinforced our position as a trusted service provider and a resolute advocate for equitable health care and the safety of women and children in our community.

MSP on the Ground

As well as using the media, MSP makes its voice heard on matters that affect women's well-being by organizing a calendar of wide-ranging public activities and by being present for collaborative advocacy efforts with government, INGO and CSO partners.

MSP CEO met with the Acting Commissioner of Police, Mr. Juki Fong Chew and senior officers to reaffirm the Memorandum of Agreement between MSP and Fiji Police that cements our close cooperation between CASOU and our post rape clinic.



International Women's Day

MSP North facilitated a talanoa session on the IWD theme of 'Embracing Equity' for participants in IWD activities organized by Ronald McDonald House Fiji which supports the Family Room at Labasa Hospital and provides families with the necessary resources to help their children recover.



MSP Central provided health services in Waidina District of Naitasiri for the EU project Preventing COVID-19, Protecting Rights, Supporting Survivors at an IWD event to recognize women bread-winners and community organizers, their high chief, and women working in Naitasiri services.

MSP West partnered with Hilton Beach Resort in Denarau to mark IWD, offering free SRHR services for the 50 women who work there, including screenings for cervical cancer and NCDs, breast examinations, family planning consultations, and counselling.

Pinktober

MSP Central team partnered with Nausori Town Council during Pinktober to bring health and social services closer to market vendors from Naitasiri, Rewa and Tailevu.

Milestones of the Year

In October 2023 in Qelekoro Village, Tailevu, we stood together with the Minister for MOWCSP, the Honourable Lynda Tabuya to unveil the first pledge board. The boards, erected in all 10 target communities, marked the commitment of each village to create safe and healthy communities, as each pledged to strengthen protection, change social norms, and ensure justice for survivors of gender-based violence.



The Embassy of Japan handed over two new 4 x 4 Toyota Hilux vehicles with trailers funded by the Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human Security Projects (GGP) program. The vehicles made a valuable addition both to outreach services to rural areas of Fiji, and to enabling rapid, safe and effective responses during emergencies.



Other Milestones

MSP joined in the Sugar Cane Growers Fund (SCGF) Open Day held in July in Kabisi, Nadroga offering medical check-ups, NCD screenings, SRH services, and counselling to the attending farmers.

MSP Central was on the spot in Albert Park in Suva for the 3-day MHMS Health Expo: Wellbeing Wholeheartedly in October with free rapid HIV tests that show results within 15 minutes, PAP smears, breast exams, STI screenings and family planning options.



MSP North collaborated with the Fiji Disabled People's Federation (FDPF) and MHMS to pilot the Disability Inclusion Project on SRHR funded by UNFPA Pacific and the Australian Government in Labasa (Bua and Macuata) and Tukavesi (Buca Bay).

In November, MSP visited FRIEND Fiji in Tuvu for breast and cervical cancer screenings. Dr Salome again highlighted the importance of early detection to saving lives. Vinaka vakalevu European Union in the Pacific for your continued support.



MSP North joined with MWCSP to be part of the 2023 Women's Expo in Savusavu in March attended by women from Cakaudrove, Bua and Macuata who showcased their many handicrafts and built connections and business opportunities. The MSP booth shared IECs and offered consultations and advice on SRHR to participants and visitors.



MSP West facilitated a consultation with 14 CSOs and relevant government bodies to address increasing numbers of GBV cases and the prevalence of children living on the streets in Lautoka, to gain a better understanding of the issues and to develop collaborative strategies for a meaningful response system.

Contestants for the Lautoka Sugar Festival Queen title visited MSP to acquaint themselves with our services and cultivate an interest in researching SRH, as well as the eradication of VAWG, as part of their tertiary studies.



Other Milestones

MSP North and West teams facilitated Child Protection Awareness Training with WFF grantees Udukacu Women's Group, Taveuni Women Empowerment, Soqosoqo Vakamarama I'Taukei Cakaudrove, Bia-i-cake Women's Group Nagigi, TISI Sangam and Lifebread.



MSP West shared information and advice on WASH initiatives, SRHR, CP, GBV, Family Planning, and IECs at the World Food Day National Agriculture Show organised by the Ministry of Agriculture and Waterways Fiji.



The 2023 Girmit Day celebration at Naivilaca Village aimed to bridge the past and present. The MSP team was there offering crucial clinical services, counselling and legal advice, and was lucky enough to make an unforgettable visit to the wreck of the Indian migrant ship, Syria, at Nasilai Reef.



Visitors

Throughout the year MSP welcomes many officials and delegations from around Fiji and other countries interested in our clinical and outreach activities.


